Inter-clubs develop fellowship between clubs and encourage involvement of club members with other members of our Kiwanis family. Inter-clubs may also encourage an exchange of meeting programs and valuable service and fund raising ideas with other clubs to the mutual benefit of each.

Inter-club committees By developing a plan for the year and informing club members of the dates, then chances are more members will inter-club. Plan for achieving the annual **Round Robin award!**

This award notes that members of the club have achieved a minimum of 10 Inter-Clubs in the current Kiwanis year with a minimum of one visit with each club in its own division.

Benefits of Inter-Clubbing

- It's FUN!
- It's an opportunity to get acquainted with your fellow club members by carpooling.
- Make new friends in Kiwanis.
- Exchange ideas between clubs (the good, the bad, and the ugly).
- Foster development of more willing and enthusiastic leadership.
- All the above benefits lead to good, fun meetings and well-organized, active clubs which attract and keep its members.
- By encouraging new members to join the visits will help them learn more about Kiwanis. It is surprising what you learn about your fellow Kiwanians when you carpool.
- When mingling with the host club, you learn more about the club and their projects.
- Borrow the host club's gavel to have them visit your club with an interclub to retrieve their gavel. Be sure, of course, to send them a ransom note so they will know who has their gavel!



Opportunities to Inter-Club

Parallel Committee Exchange – Plan Inter-club meetings as a committee. Arrange to sit with your respective committee. Exchanging ideas and experiences will benefit both clubs.

Fellowship sharing – Opportunity to share fellowship and ideas with members of the Kiwanis family.

Charter Presentations – Perfect occasion when the District Governor presents a charter to a new club. Not only does this stimulate the new club, but all visiting Kiwanians gain a renewed interest.

New Clubs – The first year of a new club's life is often the most critical period. Frequent inter-club meetings by the sponsoring club and other clubs in the division help to make the new club members welcome and valued.

Service Leadership Programs – KEY Club and CKI are members of the Kiwanis family. It is encouraging to our young leaders when Kiwanis members visit.

President's Exchange Week – A president's exchange week might be established in which all clubs in a division could exchange presidents. The visiting president would preside, and the visiting club would furnish the program. Members of the president's club would accompany him/her on the exchange.

Unusual or Special Program – The club holding the special program could notify other clubs in the Division of their special guest or program. Great opportunity for a number of clubs to get-together.

Inter-Division Inter-Club Meetings – Plan an interchange of Lt. governors, accompanied by the members of their home clubs. Inter-Division fellowship comes alive and inter-club relations take on added direction.

ROUND ROBIN Score Sheet

All of the following require a **minimum of 2 members** (clubs 20 or less) **minimum of 3 members** (clubs 21-30) **minimum of 4 members** (clubs 31+) in order to make up an Inter-Club. This Inter-club promotion is to encourage **all members** of the club to participate and not just the same 2 or 3 every Inter-club. The club that has the most number of points and has completed all of the below will receive **\$100.00** towards the registration to the 2009 District Convention in Medford, OR. If there is a tie – then a draw will be made.

To obtain a round robin patch:	Possible Points	Total Points
Must do 24 or more inter-clubs in one year – October 1, 2008 to September 30, 2009 (in order to qualify, the club MUST have <u>Inter-Clubbed with each club in their Division at least once</u>)	1 point for (10) minimum plus 1 point for each interclub over the minimum	
Inter-club with additional 2 or more than the required minimum of members	1 point per Inter-Club	
Inter-club with any Key Club. CKI, Builders, K-Kids or Aktion club	4 points each	
Do a special Inter-Club with any other club that is in stalling a New member.	4 points each	
Attend a Zone Conference and receive credit with any club in your Division that also has four members present	1 per club	
Attend the District Convention (minimum of 4 members)	2 points	
Attend any club in your division where the PNW Governor is in attendance. (minimum of 4 members)	4 points
